### Wildlife In Our Village

A slight detour from my wildlife garden - walking back through Newton Greenways, we were stopped in our tracks by a tree. Anyone could have been mistaken into thinking that this tree had been sprayed white for the coming festive season! It was, in fact, a White Poplar, *populus alba* of the family *Salicaceae*. White Poplar is a deciduous broadleaf tree which can grow to 20m.

The bark is pale grey with lines of black diamond-shaped pores called lenticles. Its twigs are white; young twigs have a covering of dense white hair that lasts until their second year. Look out for the underside of the leaves which is paler than the upper side. The stems of the leaves are also distinctly flattened. It is the whitest tree in the landscape and from a distance it can appear to be covered in snow.

In winter the White Poplar's twigs, especially older ones, are very knobbly. Buds spiral round and are closely pressed to the twig. Its leave are dark green-grey, and whitish on the underside thanks to a bright white coating of woolly hair. Most of the leaves have five lobes and have irregular teeth around the edge.

The tree gives huge value to wildlife: a variety of moth caterpillars feed on its leaves, including the puss moth, pink-barred sallow, poplar grey, yellow-line quaker, dingy shear's and the sallow kitten. The catkins are an early source of pollen and nectar for bees and other insects and its seeds are eaten by birds.

In ancient Greek mythology the white poplar was consecrated to Hercules after he destroyed Cacus, a fire-breathing giant, next to the Aventine Hill which was covered with white poplars. People offering sacrifices to Hercules were always crowned with branches of white poplar and those who conquered their enemies in battle wore white poplar garlands.

Historically, the white poplar has been used in medicine, particularly its bark, which has astringent, antiseptic and anti-inflammatory properties. Taken internally, it was used for many complaints, ranging from rheumatism and digestive problems to lower back pain and gout. Externally the bark was made into a poultice to treat infected wounds, haemorrhoids and chilblains. Nowadays, the leaves are used to treat tooth decay. Did you know that the white poplar is non-native, but references to "Abel " trees in historic documents indicate it has been here for a long time.

Take time to stop and look when out and about.

#### News from the Newton Flotman Parish Council - 1st November 2022

### **Budget Setting and Community Grants**

The Parish Council are now considering the budget for the next financial year. In addition to funds being allocated for grass cutting area such as King's Green, the emptying of dog waste bins and the running of the Youth Club, money is also allocated to local groups and organisations through grants to projects such as NFaST, maintaining the churchyard and the wildlife there and Village Centre projects. The Council is aware of the cost-of-living crisis and wants to ensure that the budget reflects this. The budget will be confirmed at the meeting on 29<sup>th</sup> November and the precept for 23/24 set. The precept is the portion of money from residents council tax that is allocated to the parish council. More information can be found on your council tax bill which will be sent out by South Norfolk Council in the spring.

### Youth Club

Did you know that there is a youth club run by the YMCA in Newton Flotman?

The youth club meets every Wednesday at the village hall between 6:00 and 8:00 PM and is aimed at children between 8 and 14 years old. Staff from the YMCA, who are trained and have all the safeguarding certification, supervise and manage the children's activities each week with themes this autumn around fireworks, Armistice Day, road safety, St Andrew's Day and diabetes awareness.

At the present time there are vacancies in the youth club so if you would like your child to have the opportunity to be with other children of a similar age in a safe environment one evening a week, then please contact the YMCA at 07894935775 or **youthclubs@ymcanorfolk.org** to book a place.

### Neighbourhood planning

At the Parish Council meeting on 29<sup>th</sup> November, we will be examining the subject of neighbourhood planning. Neighbourhood planning was introduced by the government in 2011 and "*is an important and powerful tool that gives communities statutory powers to shape how their communities develop*" according to Locality (**locality.org.uk**).

Locality state that a neighbourhood plan is a document that sets out planning policies for a Parish or Town which can:

Protect local green spaces

Encourage better designed places

Bring forward housing that genuinely meets local needs.

The document is written by the local community and helps get the right types of development, in the right place.
