The Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan is a planning policy document written by the community to guide future development in the area over the next 20 years.

Neighbourhood plan

A Steering Group of Parish Councillors and local residents are involved in listening to the community to form the content of the Neighbourhood Plan. Members include: Paul

Weeks (Chair), Martin Brooks (Vice chair), Ann Segens, Bob McKibbin, Drew Broad, Joel Fiddy, Sharon Pover, and Carol Watson. Please contact Newton Flotman Parish Clerk if you would like to get involved.

The steering group held a one day workshop on 13th January where we drafted the following vision for the Neighbourhood Plan:

'Newton Flotman will remain a cohesive rural community with good infrastructure for all. New development will reflect current and future needs of the parish, be well designed, environmentally sustainable and sympathetic to the character of Newton Flotman. Our wildlife, green spaces and local heritage will be valued and protected'.

This month we are commissioning some research into the housing needs of the village and design codes for future development.

In February we will be undertaking a character appraisal of the village so you may see members of the steering group walking around the village to identify the character of sections of Newton Flotman.

How you can help

We need your input on the issues of concern to our village. We have an online map where you can drop a pin on a specific point in the village and tell us 'what you like', 'what you don't like' or 'something that we need to work on'. You can use your smart phone, tablet or computer, walking about the area or at home. www.placecheck.info/app/maps/nf

We are into 2024! And experiencing a cold winter. Wrap up warm, stay active and stay safe from the numerous viruses that are characteristic of the time of year. The pandemic finally ended and we remember with sadness those that lost their lives to COVID19.

In this first article of the year, I want to discuss one of our important patient reviews. This is the Cancer Care review appointment that we offer our patients with cancer ideally within three months of the initial diagnosis. This is one of our patient objectives recommended by the quality and outcome framework. However, I see this appointment as crucial whether face to face or as a telephone appointment and many of my GP colleagues will agree with me. In the early months after a diagnosis of cancer, patients are looked after in every way by the hospital teams and as a GP, I have a very limited role. The Cancer Care review appointment gives us the opportunity to talk to a patient going through a very difficult phase in his/her life.

The Macmillan Cancer support website defines clearly a Cancer Care review: A Cancer Care Review (CCR) is a conversation between a patient and a Health or Social Care professional about their experience with cancer. It is essential to personalised care and helps patients to:

talk about their cancer experience and concerns understand what support is available in their community

receive the information they need to begin supported self-management.

My request is that if you have not had a call from your GP in those early months, it might be due to delay in paperwork and the associated logistics. Please do not hesitate to ring Reception and request an appointment with your GP or a clinician. We understand the sensitivity and emotional turmoil that can accompany such a diagnosis and it is important to remember that your GP practice can support, and sign post you to appropriate services.
