Curate's Corner

At the time of writing, verges and gardens are filled with vivid, yellow daffodils. Birds are singing and building nests and the shops are full of hot cross buns and Easter eggs. Lambs with wobbly legs can be found gambolling in the fields. Dormant trees are bursting into life and days are becoming warmer. On Easter Day we will be celebrating the good news of Easter in our churches. Here is part of the Easter story told by Joanna, one of Jesus' followers:



Friday was a bleak day; we nicknamed it Bleak

Friday. The trial was over. The crowds who had cheered, waved palm branches and welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem only a few days earlier had turned against him. Moods can suddenly change and envelop large crowds. Now people were shouting for Jesus to die. 'Crucify him,' they screamed.

It was a horrible time. Jesus' mother, Mary, was completely distraught. The rest of us women were trying to support her and cope with our own feelings of bewilderment. The long-awaited Messiah had arrived and was to die. The male disciples had all disappeared but us women followed the procession to the cross on the hill of Calvary. The sky turned black and darkness covered the earth. We were there when Jesus' body was taken down from the cross. We watched while a man called Joseph asked for that poor battered body. Together with the Roman soldiers he placed it in this stone tomb. Using all their strength, the burly soldiers pushed a large rock into place sealing the entrance to the tomb.

The next day was the sabbath. We spent the day trying to find the myrrh and aloes that we would need to anoint Jesus' body.

We woke early, at sunrise on Sunday morning and us women hurried to the tomb with the myrrh and aloes we had painstakingly collected. We had no idea how we would manoeuvre the stone in front of the entrance but were shaken to find it had already been moved aside. We cautiously entered; Jesus' body was not there! Suddenly, two figures in dazzling clothes appeared beside us. I was terrified and focussed my eyes on the dusty ground. The angels gave us the most amazing message: 'Jesus is not here, he has risen!' Suddenly, everything Jesus had told us during the preceding months made sense. We rushed from the tomb to share the good news that Jesus was alive! He had risen from the dead!

On Easter Day, Sunday 17th April, we will be celebrating Jesus rising from the dead. All are welcome to join us at Swainsthorpe church at 9.30am and at Newton Flotman church at 11am.

We achieved our target to collect a tonne of bras for Against Breast Cancer.

Launched at our first event six years ago; it was interesting to hear how people had been seen taking photos of the bras on the washing line by the advertising boards to send to friends which in turn, became the bra fairies who left parcels on my doorstep!

The bras are then shipped out to Africa as African women wearing underwear are less likely to be sexually abused. We have helped an AMAZING 17,000 women STAY SAFE FROM SEXUAL ABUSE.

Our event on 5th March was attended by over 60 women and it was a joy to hear how they came from far and wide; reminding us of the original funding requirement that we encourage people from outside Swainsthorpe to use the Community Centre.

We raised £345 from ticket sales and £180 raffle, bringing the total to £525. Funds to be distributed as follows:

Toilet Twinning: £240 for a toilet block in a refugee camp

£60 for a family toilet

Bell Fund £100

£100 Swainsthorpe Charity Trust towards the upkeep of our church/ Community Centre

And £100 towards the Bell Fund, to help our dream to hear the bells ring from St Peter's Church, once more.

Leaving £25 to add to the International Women's Day account to run future events for women.

I would like to thank everyone who has collected bra's over the years to help so many women and to encourage you to keep doing so, after all they only go to landfill!

Finally, a big thank you to our speakers and Fundraising Ideas Group know as the FIGS, for running the event. Next year's event will be held on Saturday March 4th 2023!

Celebration as Norfolk's newest long-distance trail is launched at Wymondham

A new walking route, the Kett's Country Norfolk Trail, was launched at the end of last month outside Wymondham Abbey. The 18-mile route starts in Wymondham where the story of Kett's Rebellion began in July 1549. It finishes in Eaton, just past Cringleford's historic twin-arched bridge, which Robert Kett crossed with his followers on his journey to Norwich to seek a fairer society, all those years ago.

The project, which cost £97,630, has been funded by the Greater Norwich Growth Board (GNGB) through the Infrastructure Investment Fund.

This wonderful 18-mile trail will link Wymondham and Norwich, and is the newest addition to the ever-popular Norfolk Trails' network of more than 1,200 miles of long-distance routes right across Norfolk. For those for looking for something less strenuous there are also five mini adventures to enjoy along the way, with waymarked circular walks at Wymondham, Wreningham, Mulbarton, Swardeston and Cringleford. Each of these shorter routes, which were voted for by the public, have their own name, fascinating history and wildlife.

Aside from the start and end points, the trail does not follow the actual route that Kett and his followers took, but instead weaves along the picturesque South Norfolk Claylands countryside – an important area for nature.

Wymondham's Abbey Trail, the route chosen for visitors to the launch, is the shortest circular walk at 1.1 miles, and has also been access tested by wheelchair users. The trail follows existing paths which have seen recent revamps to a number of bridges, steps, boardwalks and gates along the way so they're ready to welcome explorers of the new waymarked routes.

New information boards at each end and the midway point will bring the trail's history and wildlife stories to life. Visitors will soon find a carved bench at the start of the trail at Wymondham and a wooden sculpture at the end in Eaton, carved by popular local artist, Arnie Barton.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!

The latest in Norfolk's growing chain of reuse shops has opened at Norwich South recycling centre. The bright, spacious, purpose-built shop is set to save 100 tonnes of good quality second-hand items from being thrown away each year.

It has also been revealed that Big C is the new chosen charity which will receive a cut of the proceeds from the reuse shops. Since the first reuse shop opened in King's Lynn in 2008 more than £35,000 has been raised for charities, including East Anglian Air Ambulance.

Norfolk's reuse shops welcome donations of good quality second-hand pieces and sell these on at car boot prices. Helping to give things a new home reduces the amount of unwanted items going to waste and income from sales in the shops helps to offset the cost of providing the recycling centre
