Trees and footpaths

As the leaves begin to drop off the trees and with winter around the corner now is the ideal time to ensure that trees and bushes on property boundaries are pruned and not overhanging or impeding footpaths. Please ensure that paths are kept clear to allow pedestrians unobstructed access.

Annual budget setting

At the November Parish Council meeting the 2025/26 budget for the Parish Council will be considered and agreed. The Parish Council are responsible for a number of functions in the village including the emptying of dog waste bins, grass cutting of the village green, the upkeep of a number of assets including grit bins, dog waste bins, noticeboards, bus shelter and benches, managing the allotments and supporting the Youth Club. In addition the Parish Council currently give grant donations to the church for the maintenance of the churchvard and a contribution towards Partnership magazine and a contribution towards grass cutting, and other maintenance costs at the Village Centre

The Parish Council precept, or contribution towards financing the Parish Council budget, is part of the Council tax bill that is collected by South Norfolk Council. It also includes contributions towards Norfolk County Council, South Norfolk Council and The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.

Members of the public are welcome to attend the meeting and listen to discussions as the budget for the ensuing year is agreed.

Solar panels for your house?

Have you considered having solar panels fitted to your house? With electricity expensive to buy and solar panels getting cheaper it's worth thinking about. Trouble is it can be quite difficult to sort out. Is your roof big enough. Does it face the right way? Is it shaded by other buildings or trees?



Then if you decide to go ahead you really need three quotes from different companies - even then how to decide which is best?

The South Norfolk district council are promoting a business called Solar Together* who can help simplify the process and get a good cheap quote.

It's simple enough to register online - they ask you a few questions about your house. They then use the power of group buying to get you a good price. They check out the installer carefully. Then they offer you a price and an installer for your solar panels. You don't have to accept it - you can decide not to go ahead if you wish.

If you do go ahead the installer will contact you and carry out a full survey. Important to note that your contract is then with the installer - Solar Together are an independent company who find the installers and negotiate prices.

It may seem a funny time of year to be talking about solar power for our houses - just as we enter the months when the sun is weakest. But the process of getting solar panels will take a few months - especially as installers are busy.

There don't seem to be grants available for solar panels but loans may be possible from the government via the new "Green deal". The government green deal page also suggests ways of saving energy in your home. Find them on line here:

Swainsthorpe Parish Council Notes - 11th September 2024

At the meeting we received updates on local green energy projects and proposals:

National Grid: Norwich to Tilbury The official consultation has completed and the decision now lies with the Secretary of State.

Norwich Main Substation Extension This project was approved by South Norfolk District Council and work has commenced on construction.

Orsted – Hornsea 3 Construction of the Converter Station continues apace despite problems with flooding. Orsted have informed SNDC that the BESS to be installed will be one of the largest in Europe.

Equinor - SEP and DEP This project has now been approved by the outgoing Secretary of State, but work has yet to begin.

EDF - Blovs Grove Solar Farm and Cable Connection The Traffic Management Plan has been approved by SNDC and will include HGVs going through the village of Swainsthorpe for the duration of the construction period (likely to be 9 months). A start date has not been confirmed. The cable connection has been approved with 12 conditions covering archaeology, badgers, noise and dust amongst other matters.

EDF – BESS On land north of Hickling Lane No work has started on this. and the field concerned has been left fallow this year.

FPC - BESS on land north of Stoke Lane An application for a second means of access to the site has been approved by SNDC.

Other matters discussed:

Robin Parkinson reported that the Swainsthorpe Community Charity Trust are planning to put an artificial Christmas tree on the green.

It was agreed that the PC should donate £300 p.a. to the Partnership magazine and the first payment has been made.

Our Neighbourhood Plan is under way, and we have secured funding for the whole project. We have a Steering Group of 13 parishioners and have appointed consultants to guide us through the project.

We have requested a TPO online for the Millennium Oak and it is hoped that news will be received soon.

The refurbishment of the telephone box is complete, with grateful thanks to Charles and Rosemary Carron Brown. A defibrillator with locked box has been ordered and once received, training will take place.

The PC has been successful in obtaining £20k from South Norfolk Council, thanks to District Cllr John Cook's help. The outcome of the Lottery grant is still pending.

Since the last meeting there had been five sessions by the Speedwatch team. We are encouraged that more drivers are respecting the 30mph speed limit through the village.

The next meeting has been arranged for Wednesday 20th November 2024 and all residents are warmly invited to attend. Festive refreshments will be provided following the meeting. Council contact: Nicola LeDain (Parish Clerk)
