'Use It Or Lose It ... '

You may have heard by now that reorganisation is planned for the churches in this area. Details were made public on 30th January and this is the first opportunity I've had to share them with those who do not attend their local church.

I head up a small team which looks after a group of churches comprising: Saxlingham, Shotesham, Swainsthorpe, Newton, Tasburgh and Tharston. For financial reasons, the Church of England is looking to rationalise – particularly in rural areas. I will therefore be given the care of an additional group comprising: Forncett St Peter, Forncett St Mary, Forncett End, Hapton, Wreningham, Tacolneston, Ashwellthorpe and Fundenhall when the current vicar of those parishes retires at the end of April. Early this summer, we expect legalities to be completed enabling the two groups of churches to be identified as one larger group. Sadly, we will lose the parish of Tharston, which is being grouped with Long Stratton.

Aside from our work in the churches, we also go into our nursing homes and church schools on a regular basis. We have three church schools in our current group – the new group comes with an additional four church schools.

Inevitably this will involve change – possibly a reduction in the number of Sunday services that are available. Our 'staff team' will gain volunteers from the additional parishes – but they are already nearing or beyond retirement age. Our Team Vicar, Revd Austin Uzoigwe is a full-time paid minister, as am I. Revd Coryn Stanforth is full-time but will be obliged to leave here at the end of her curacy (essentially a training post) in approximately 18 months. The majority of people who keep our local churches running are volunteers – not only lay ministers but a larger number of people who deal with the upkeep and maintenance of our buildings and churchyards, cleaning, locking and unlocking and a host of other unseen but vital tasks.

I am beyond grateful to each person I work with, lay and ordained, paid and voluntary and it is my heartfelt prayer that I may be able to continue to serve this larger group of parishes with some kind of effectiveness for some while to come. If you have any concerns or questions regarding any of this, please do contact me.

Last month I reported that we were waiting to hear what the plans are for the **reorganisation** of the parishes in our benefice and deanery. We are happy to say that we are joining with the 8 parishes of the Upper Tas Valley. Dawn

and Austin will be the incumbents of 13 parishes along with Coryn for the rest of her curacy. The ball is starting to roll informally but there will be an official service to recognise the formation of the new benefice later in the year.

We are revisiting the project to unthether the **pews** in church, incorporating castors so that they can be moved, while retaining the medieval pew ends. This would be to give more flexibility in using the space in the church. We have had permission to do this for five years and the diocese is keen for us to make a decision before June which has focussed our minds.

There has been some communication between village organisations sounding out plans for the **Coronation** weekend 6th-8th May, do get in touch if you have some ideas! One thing we do know is that there will be no beacon lighting, so as to distinguish the event from last year's Jubilee event. But I am reliably informed that it will be back to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day next year!

The members of the Patient Participation Group have been working with the surgery over the past few months to find new ways to meet the health needs of patients. We are keen to provide additional support to patients by providing an informal environment in which they can talk openly, and safely, with other patients who are in a similar situation and a "Health Champion." over a cup of tea/coffee.

Health Champions are patients who have themselves experienced medical conditions that they have either survived or are living with, and they are voluntarily giving up their time to support others. The overall aim is to start a feeling of community, perhaps help build links, contacts and even friendships as a network outside of the clinical and family environment. These coffee get-togethers are intended to be a space where people can - if they wish to - share their own concerns as a result of their diagnosis as well as "lived experiences."

Our first meeting is on 1st March and patients who have recently been diagnosed with cancer have been invited. This is our first get together of this kind, our health champions are cancer survivors, and some who are living with the effects of this. We are hopeful to be able to have an invited speaker from a relevant organisation in the charity sector, as least at the first or second meeting.

South Norfolk Village Clusters

Over a number of years South Norfolk Council have developed the South Norfolk Village Clusters Housing Allocations Plan. Within this plan, areas across the district are highlighted where new developments would be most appropriate.

The development of 25 houses on land adjacent to Alan Avenue has been included in this plan. Any developer who wished to build these houses would have to go through the normal planning process. The process is now entering the legal stages and seeking approval at full council before being scrutinised by the planning inspectorate. The process is expected to be completed in Spring 2024

Neighbourhood Planning

There was further discussion of the merits of undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. It was agreed to discuss this at a future community event to gauge if there is the interest in the village. As previously mentioned putting together a neighbourhood plan takes considerable time and resources. Therefore any decision to undertake the development of a Neighbourhood Plan must be done with the consideration and support of residents

Royal Horticultural Society - Garden Jobs To Do This Month Spring arrives!

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up around the garden.

Ten jobs that you should think about doing this month are:

- 1. Prune bush and climbing roses
- 2. Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes
- 3. Plant summer-flowering bulbs
- 4. Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials
- 5. Top dress containers with fresh compost
- 6. Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed)
- 7. Cut back Cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems
- 8. Hoe and mulch weeds to keep them under control early
- 9. Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain; remove pond heaters
- 10. Protect new spring shoots from slugs
