I inadvertently upset someone recently by mentioning that although we celebrate the birth of Jesus on 25<sup>th</sup> December, we don't actually know on what day he was born – and it's highly unlikely to have been in December at all.

Some of the beliefs we have about Christmas have been 'handed down' to us, or gleaned from various other sources...Christmas carols for example. *We three kings*...the Bible doesn't say how many there were and doesn't describe them as kings. *Little donkey*...it's possible that Mary rode a donkey to Bethlehem but the Bible doesn't give us that information.

#### Here's another one:

*Silent night, holy night, all is calm, all is bright...*A holy night, without doubt. But hardly silent. Bethlehem was filled to bursting with visitors obliged to come and register for the census. As we come to the close of 2023 and look forward to the festive and new year period, it is time to reflect on this year, and look forward to 2024!

We would like to thank you all for your kindness, consideration, and understanding throughout 2023, it really has been appreciated, especially the very positive comments that came through from both our Healthwatch Surveys.

To get us into the festive spirit on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> December, which has become a bit of a tradition, we have invited the Salvation Army band down for a couple of hours in the afternoon to play some festive tunes for us, please come and join us. They are going to play at Harker House first but will be with us from about 3:30pm.

We would like to recognise that this year has been challenging for us in many ways. From negotiating with our building owners, the planning department and NHS England at the start of the year, and then, from May it has been all systems go! It is hard to believe that just 6 months ago the ground at the back of the surgery was just a grassy area, and now we have a purpose-built extension which will give us 7 brand new clinical rooms. By the time that you read this the new rooms will be in operation, and the builders would have moved inside our existing building, to start on refurbishing the rooms in what we know as "the Doctors Corridor."

From early December through until the second

week in January, the doctors will be out of their original consulting rooms and be in the new extension. We will all be getting used to navigating our way around - and would ask that you bear with the reception team as there are bound to be times of confusion as we get used to our new layout. Once the doctors corridor is refurbished, we will then bring the GP's back into their usual rooms and swap the nurses out to allow their rooms to be completed.



Probably the biggest impact will be after the nurses rooms are finished. because then we will be moving into the waiting room, and front lobby changing flooring and the configuration of the main reception desk. It is during this time that we will really need your support and understanding as it's the bit that will cause the most disruption for you, our patients, and perhaps create the biggest challenge for our dispensary and reception teams.

#### Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan steering group

First, I would like to thank everybody who expressed their views about Newton Flotman when the Parish Council had their roadshow at the end of August. We received twelve expressions of interest from residents to join a steering group to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for the village.

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been formed and has held two meetings in October and November. Rachel Leggett & Associates, a planning consultancy which has experience in helping 30 town and parish councils (including Tasburgh) to produce neighbourhood plans, has been asked to provide the steering group with a proposal on how it can assist us to develop our plan. Applications for funding from South Norfolk District Council and Locality have been submitted and we should know the outcome in December.

Assuming we get the funding we need, the steering group will commence work on gathering the evidence needed to create the Neighbourhood Plan in January 2024. We are aiming to complete the work by December next year, at which time we will submit the plan to South Norfolk District Council for approval.

The steering group wants to have the maximum possible input into the plan from you, the residents of Newton Flotman, and we want to do this in an open way. Our meetings, which will be held on the third Monday in the month, will be open for you to attend and observe. All the agendas and minutes will be available on the Newton Flotman Parish Council website.

A household survey will be carried out in the spring when we will be seeking your views about Newton Flotman.
