#### Gardening - Advice for April from the RHS

Spring usually starts to arrive across the country in March, and the longer days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds and sowing seed, and it's your last chance to prune roses.

By the time April arrives, spring is finally in evidence as daffodils and flowering trees start to bloom. Expect the inevitable April showers month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month, with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing outdoors as the soil warms up. Just watch out for any final frosts!

- 1) Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wild flower seed outdoors
- 2) Protect fruit blossom from late frosts
- 3) Tie in climbing and rambling roses
- 4) Keep weeds under control
- 5) Start to feed citrus plants
- 6) Increase the water given to houseplants
- 7) Feed hungry shrubs and roses
- 8) Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
- 9) Prune fig trees
- 10) Divide bamboos and waterlilies

If you are looking for a gardening project, you might like to sow a wildflower patch. Brighten up a spare area of ground by sowing wildflower seeds in spring or autumn. It's quick and easy, and the resulting summer display will attract lots of pollinating insects.

Quick facts:

- Most wildflowers, particularly cornfield annuals, need a sunny spot but there are mixes available for light shade
- You can sow a wildflower patch in mid-spring (April) or early autumn
- Minimal soil preparation is required
- Your wildflower patch can be as big or small as you like you could even sow into containers if garden space is limited

Getting started with your wildflower patch is easy. Annual wildflower seeds can be sown in mid-spring or early autumn. There are many mixes available, with different blends of wildflowers, some of which include grasses for a meadow effect.

Make sure you buy enough seeds for the area you want to sow – check the seed packet for the sowing rate (usually in grams per square metre) and measure up your site.

For a natural effect, it's best to scatter (broadcast) the seeds rather than sowing in straight lines. The easiest way to get an even distribution is to mix the seeds with a small quantity of dry sand – you can then see where and how densely you've sown. Remember to water the area well for a super display which will attract bees and butterflies and other pollinating insects!

#### Wildlife Back Garden

'Protect and promote' - the article in last month's Partnership magazine - discussed developing a biodiversity policy and action plan for Newton Flotman village, to work with local groups, perhaps starting in our own gardens/ private spaces.

I have had a wildlife garden ever since moving to 1, Clabburn Close, several years ago. I left the plants found in the land down the side of my house to grow, and after one month Bee Orchids started appearing!

In 2018 I emailed Saffron Housing (responsible for mowing the verge to the side of my house) and gave all my neighbours a card, informing them that I would be planting wildflower plugs into the area to create a wildflower meadow. This area is clearly shown on Saffron's cutting plan with a red border marker signifying 'Not to cut here'.

It's now eight years since Saffron stopped mowing and strimming. Cherry Plum Trees are now flourishing. Many years ago, before houses were built in this area, there used to be an orchard here. The roots and the fallen stones/ seeds were lying dormant all that time, until the area was left untouched.

Newcomers into the village - please may I inform you that this area is privately managed and maintained as and when it needs to be. It may not be to everyone's liking, but *that's biodiversity*!

Bee Orchids flower every eight years, and all wildflowers are protected by law. 38 different species of wildflowers are now growing in the wild verge area by my house, dropping their seeds after scything. Yes, the sheer joy of being able to do this myself (being paraplegic) is one of immense satisfaction. It's so much quieter than strimmers or mowers, and it gives the wildlife the chance to survive.

By letting the verge grow, it promotes a *green canopy*. Amongst the trees on the verge and in my garden there is a very old and healthy broad-leaved lime tree, together with flowering cherry, cypress (leylandii) and saplings of holly blackthorn, bramble, oak and yew. These all contribute to the biodiversity chain, through their roots and fallen leaves.

We never rake up the leaves, as eventually they break down into the soil. Birds will often flip them over to find insects to eat. they also act as a mulch and they are the preferred nesting material of hedgehogs will use to line the nests (one year I had five hedgehogs in my garden, gaining access through the 'hedgehog gateway' to and from the undisturbed grass area down the side of the house.

By not walking on this area means all wildlife is undisturbed. Four large ant hills are present 2ftx1ft their size. Also present are juvenile frogs, newts, grass snakes, an abundance of insects, and mammals. All the time birds are watching, knowing the area is safe to build nests in. Neighbours on both sides mow their grass...and the wildlife comes into my sheltered, untouched wildlife haven, to seek shelter. What some consider messy is what wildlife prefers!

## Newton Flotman Parish Council Notes 2024/25 Precept and Parish Council Funding

The Parish Council are pleased that Parish Partnership funding has been confirmed towards the installation of 'Village Gates' on Flordon Road. Norfolk County Council have pledged to pay 50% of the cost, with the remainder coming from the Parish Council Precept. The need for these traffic management measures was highlighted in the Parish Questionnaire. Through significant dialogue with the Highways department this was the scheme that met both the Parish Council's and Highways requirements. It is hoped that the work will be undertaken later this year.

There has been a significant increase in the cost of the grass cutting contract for 2024/25 and the fees for water at the allotment. Quotes were requested from three companies for the grass cutting and most competitive was agreed to. Grant funding towards the grass cutting of the Village Green has also been secured from the South Norfolk Council Clean up and Bloom Scheme. Due to the increase in the water used at the allotment the rates for the allotments have been increased to reflect this. The Parish Council awards grants to local organisations and has allocated funds to the Church for the upkeep of the Churchyard, *Partnership* magazine and the Village Centre. The money awarded to the Church and Partnership has increased by 25% and 50% respectively and allowed these projects to continue.

As a result of these and rises in other costs there will be a 22.79% increase in the Parish Council Precept for 24/25. This amounts to an average contribution of £64.13 per household annually, an increase of £11.85 per year or 23p a week. The Parish Council believes that they offer good value for money and that increases were considered at length and not taken lightly.
