**Royal Horticultural Society - The Autumn Chill Sets In** Although we had some warmer days over September, the autumn is now definitely here for real, and it feels colder. It's a beautiful time of year, with the trees changing colour.

Sometimes it may seem pointless raking, when the wind blows even more leaves onto the lawn, but just think of all the lovely leaf mould you can make! It's also time to start preparing for early frosts.

Top jobs for you this month:

- Move tender plants, including aquatic ones, into a greenhouse or conservatory. In frost-prone areas a conservatory is the ideal place for overwintering tender perennials and marginally hardy plants from the garden. Cold-sensitive plants in need of good light levels and dry, frost-free conditions will also benefit.
- Cut back perennials that have died down. Perennials are not demanding plants, but trimming them after flowering finishes in autumn helps improve their appearance and flowering. However, you can leave some stems over winter to provide homes and food for wildlife, and then trim back in spring.
- Divide herbaceous perennials. Dividing perennials regularly will ensure healthy, vigorous plants that will continue to perform year after year. It also offers the opportunity to multiply your plants.
- You can also divide established rhubarb crowns to create new plants, plant out spring cabbages, harvest apples, pears, grapes and nuts, prune climbing roses, finish collecting seeds from the garden to sow next year, mow lawns on final time and trim hedges in mild areas, and renovate old lawns or create new grass areas by laying turf.

#### **News from Newton Flotman Parish Council**

#### Housing development off Alan Avenue

The proposed development off Alan Avenue for 31 new houses was recently finalised at the South Norfolk Council Development Management committee meeting in July. This committee is the group that considers contentious planning applications.

This application was brought to the committee as the developers had requested that the number of affordable homes on the site be reduced from four to zero. The original application included seven affordable homes, which is below the 33% of housing recommended in the Greater Norwich Development Plan that Newton Flotman falls within.

At the committee meeting it was agreed it was acceptable for the number of affordable homes to be reduced to two, an improvement on the proposed zero but far off the 33% that should be provided. The Parish Council have been in contact with The Planning Department throughout this process and their comments have been disregarded and this has been frustrating. The Parish Council have been fortunate that District Councillor John Cook has been supportive during this time and represented the Parish Council at the committee meeting.

It is still unclear where the access points will be during the construction phase. It has been requested it is not off Alan Avenue but from the farm track off Flordon Road, however, these arrangements have yet to be confirmed by South Norfolk and Highways. The Parish Council are insisting it cannot be off Alan Avenue.

Newton Flotman Parish Council will continue to lobby the district council to provide sufficient affordable housing in any new developments to ensure the needs of local people are met. It is hoped that when the Neighbourhood Plan has been adopted this will put more pressure on South Norfolk Council to ensure where development is agreed 33% of housing is affordable.

It is expected that work on this development will begin during the autumn.

#### Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group



The Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been working for the last year to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for Newton Flotman. The Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan is a planning policy document written by the community to guide future development in the area over the next fourteen years up to 2038.

We have completed the drafting stage of the **Neighbourhood Plan** and will be, as required by law, making it **available for consultation** for a six-week period starting on 21<sup>st</sup>

**October and finishing on 27<sup>th</sup> November 2024.** On 21<sup>st</sup> October we will be holding a **drop-in exhibition from 3.00 – 9.00pm in the Newton Flotman Village Hall** where you will be able to read a copy of the Neighbourhood Plan and talk to the Steering Group Committee members. You will be able to leave your comments at the exhibition. Tea and coffee will be available from 3.00pm and the bar will be open from 6.00 to 9.00pm.

As we approach another winter, ensure you take care of your health. Those eligible for immunisations like the Influenza (Flu) and RSV would have heard from the practice and have appointments. Please contact the practice if you haven't heard and are eligible. The practice is only delivering the Covid vaccination to care home and housebound patients.

This month, I focus on communication between the hospital, the practice and patients. Many departments do copy the letter to the GP to you, the patient. This is essential, as it is a summary of the consultation in hospital and it allows you to go over it again in your own time. For us in the practice, it is extremely helpful especially if medication changes have been recommended. This can either be addition of a new medication, cessation of a medication or a dose reduction or increase in medication. If you do not hear from the practice within 2 - 3 weeks of your hospital appointment, please contact the practice through Reception or Dispensary.

In most cases the practice receives the letter in time, but occasionally there can be a delay in the appropriate clinician acting on the information either at the hospital or at the practice, due to various reasons like staff illness, shortage of staff and annual leave. The practice wants to ensure efficient and safe care and is working constantly on trying to improve services. One of the ways would be for you to contact us after a reasonable period which is usually 2 - 3 weeks after a hospital appointment. Please do not run out of your new or adjusted medication before contacting us.

Let us work together to look after your health and to help us practice in a satisfying and productive way.
